Snow Removal for Streets

Per City Ordinance, all vehicles need to be off streets by 3 AM the morning of the snow. To clear the city streets, snow may be pushed into the driveways which are on the city right of way.

Snow Removal for Sidewalks

Per Chapter 136.03, snow must be removed from sidewalks promptly. If a property owner doesn't remove the snow within a reasonable time, the city may do so and assess the cost against the property.

ANIMAL CONTROL

As a reminder... DOG OWNERS must clean up after their dog has used a public right of way or another's yard.

It is against the law for an owner of a dog to permit animal to discharge As a reminder... DOG OWNERS must clean up after their dog has used a public right of way or another's yard.

It is against the law for an owner of a dog to permit animal to discharge feces upon any public or private property, other than the property of the owner of the animal.

Dog's owner must *immediately* remove and clean up of the feces discharged.

It's the LAW.

Sump Pumps

Code of Ordinances: Chapter 95.04 Prohibited Acts.

Surface Run-off or Groundwater. It is prohibited to connect a roof downspout, sump pump, exterior foundation drain, areaway drain, or other source of surface run-off or groundwater to a building sewer or building drain which in turn is connected directly or indirectly to a public sanitary sewer.

Sewer Department

The following should never be flushed into the sewer system:

- Disinfecting wipes/baby wipes/moist towelettes
- Toilet cleaning pads/mop or Swiffer-type refills
- Paper towels
- Feminine hygiene products
- Disposable diapers
- Rubber gloves
- Cat toys
